Hui Ling 許寧

七月的「樂有所思」是中國作品專場,演奏者是鋼琴家許寧。

上世紀50至70年代,中國湧現一批優秀的鋼琴曲。這些大多是由傳統古曲移植 過來,保留了原來的旋律,同時揉合西方的浪漫風格。黎英海的《夕陽簫鼓》本是 琵琶古曲,改編成江南絲竹時又名為《春江花月夜》,氣氛閒適和諧。《二泉映月》 深沉悲凄,儲望華的鋼琴版本比原來的二胡獨奏織體更豐富。嗩吶名曲《百鳥朝 鳳》高亢生動,王建中的鋼琴編曲將百鳥和鳴的景象栩栩如生地展現。鋼琴本是 西方樂器,但許寧認為用鋼琴呈現中國傳統音樂很合適,不失原來的韻味。

近代中國鋼琴作品風格更為多元。許寧選奏的現代作品中,張朝的《皮黄》很有京 劇風味。樂曲將京劇唱腔融入鋼琴寫作,和聲佈局複雜精緻。而崔世光的《盤索 里》雖然受朝鮮傳統曲藝啓發,聲音卻相當現代。

許寧的曲目亦反映中國音樂的地域特色。《山丹丹開花紅艷艷》和《翻身道情》以陝 北民歌為基礎,反映北方人的熱情。陳培勳的廣東小曲則有南方人的輕鬆諧趣。

這次是縱觀中國鋼琴音樂發展的難得機會。歡迎你親身來到二號錄音室,感受音 樂裡的迷人韻味。

許寧(鋼琴)

許寧現為香港演藝學院、香港大學、香港中文大學及香港浸會大學教師。她生於北 京一個音樂世家,曾考入中央音樂學院附中受訓,後於香港演藝學院以高級優異成 績完成演藝專業文憑,並赴美國三藩市音樂學院深造,獲音樂學士與碩士學位。她 於2000年與郭品文創辦雙鋼琴組合「諄意四手」,經常演奏她們原創及改編的作 品,並舉辦國內外巡演。

Hui Ling 許寧

July's Chamber Resonance brings us an exciting all-Chinese music recital, performed by the talented pianist Hui Ling. This thoughtfully curated programme offers a fascinating journey through the development of Chinese piano music, blending tradition with modern innovation.

Between the 1950s and 1970s, a wealth of remarkable piano compositions was created by Chinese composers. Many of these pieces reimagined traditional music, integrating folk melodies with the romantic styles of Western classical music. One of the highlights is Li Yinghai's *Music at Sunset*, a serene and poetic arrangement of an ancient pipa piece that captures its harmonious atmosphere. Similarly, Chu Wanghua's arrangement of *Reflections of the Moon on Erquan* expands on the elegiac theme of the original erhu solo, adding layers of texture to create a deeply moving experience. Another standout is *Hundred Birds Paying Tribute to the Phoenix*, a lively suona-inspired piece that vividly depicts the playful chirping of birds, masterfully transcribed to the piano by Wang Jianzhong while retaining its energetic charm. Hui Ling emphasizes that, despite being a Western instrument, the piano is uniquely suited to express the essence of Chinese musical traditions.

In addition to reimaginings of traditional music, the programme also highlights the diversity of modern Chinese compositions. Zhang Zhao's *Pi Huang* draws inspiration from Peking Opera, with piano writing that mimics the distinctive singing style of this iconic art form. Meanwhile, Cui Shiguang's *Pansori* offers a contemporary twist to traditional Korean narrative songs, blending cultural heritage with a modern sensibility.

The music in this recital also reflects China's rich regional diversity. For example, *Glowing Red Morningstar Lilies and Joy of Emancipation* are based on Shaanbei folk melodies from northern China, exuding a sense of vitality and generosity characteristic of the region's culture. In contrast, the Cantonese works of Chan Pui-fan embody the relaxed and cheerful spirit of southern China.

This beautifully curated recital promises to take listeners on a captivating journey through the evolution of Chinese plano music. You are warmly invited to join us at Studio 2 for this unique musical experience.

HUI LING (piano)

Born in Beijing into a musical family, Hui Ling began piano studies at the age of three and trained at the secondary school of the Beijing Central Conservatory of Music. She completed her Professional Diploma with High Distinction at the HKAPA and earned Bachelor and Master of Music degrees in four years with a full scholarship at the San Francisco Conservatory of Music. In 2000, she co-founded the HK Duo with Julie Kuok, performing innovative concerts featuring their own arrangements and compositions, establishing herself as a versatile and accomplished pianist.
